

# WHAT CHANGES HAVE BEEN MADE?

- We face hesitation in our DLAC site plan, particularly regarding the integration of technology and what that will look like. However, over time and training, the staff has embraced technology programs and our ever-evolving site plan. This has helped to boost staff morale through encouragement and commitment to innovation.



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## PLANNED “NEXT STEPS”

- **June 2025:** Pilot first fully-remote ESL class
- **August 2025:** All staff PD for creating class hyperlinks
- **May 2026:** By the end of next school year, accessing educational materials online will be a standard practice in our school’s culture (for students and staff alike)



## HELP/SUPPORT FROM DLAC, COACHES, OTAN

We would benefit from continued support from DLAC, coaches, and OTAN in several key areas. Specifically, we need more in-depth training on Canvas, opportunities to observe online classes from other agencies to gather best practices, and access to a tech screener tool to help determine student readiness and eligibility for online learning.
