Go to the following website address. You will read and listen to an essay written by Jon Carroll, a newspaper columnist from San Francisco. In his essay, Jon says, "I believe in the power of failure." Read and listen to the essay, and then try to answer the questions below. (Use your own paper if necessary.)

1. In his essay, Jon says the following:

"Success is boring. Success is proving that you can do something that you already <u>know</u> you can do... Failure is how we learn."

--What does this quote mean to you? Explain it in your own words.

2. In his essay, Jon also says, "first time success is usually a <u>fluke</u>." Look up the word <u>fluke</u> (n.) in the dictionary and then try to explain what Jon means.

4. In paragraph 4, the author says, "I've learned to <u>cherish</u> that column." Use a dictionary to find a definition for the word <u>cherish</u> (verb).

5. In paragraph 6, the author uses the term **<u>perfectionist</u>**. What does this mean? In what way is being a perfectionist perhaps a <u>negative</u> thing?

6. Write about an experience in which you failed or made a mistake, and how that negative experience helped you learn something, do something better the next time, or made you stronger.
