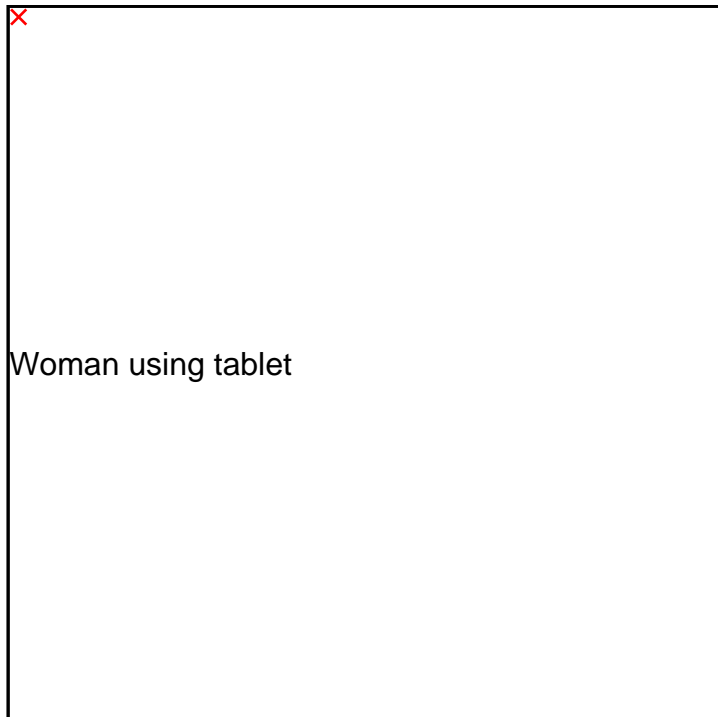





Web-based Class Activities and Tech Videos on the OTAN Website
