

The California Adult Education Students Succeed program identifies learners who have reached their goals as a result of their participation in the adult education system. The project disseminates the stories of these students and the exemplary programs that assisted them. Student success stories may be highlighted at conferences throughout California and distributed to local, regional, and state officials.

We would like to congratulate this year's accomplished honorees: Wendy Samayoa and Patricia Holmes. We would like to thank Stephanie Kriebel at San Mateo Adult School and Jerry Yamashita at Highlands Community Charter School for nominating this year's winners.

#### **Wendy Samayoa**

Wendy arrived from Guatemala in July 2016 and began ESL classes at San Mateo Adult School. Shortly thereafter, she enrolled in the high school diploma program. In her country, Wendy was a college-educated teacher; learning English and getting her diploma were like starting over. Wendy joined SMAS's Ambassador program, welcoming new students to school. She served as Student Council President for the 2017—18 school year. She presented at two conferences on "Student Leaders as Agents of Change." She also helped pioneer two ESL activities: the City Government Academy and the Eat Healthy Be Active Community Health Program. Wendy graduated with her diploma in June 2018 and will study ESL at community college this year. She continues to provide language and translation support to beginning ESL classes. She has been encouraged to become a teacher in the United States.





#### **Patricia Holmes**

In 2004, Patricia Holmes's husband left her. Within ninety days, her car was repossessed and she faced homelessness as a single mother with a criminal history. After hitting "rock bottom," Patricia moved to Sacramento. She attended two adult schools, but after a few years she was still no closer to her diploma. She felt like giving up. She found a coach who directed her to the Greater Sacramento Urban League and the Highlands Community Charter School in May 2015. In February 2016, Patricia started the felony expungement process, and by December, her record was cleared. At Highlands, Patricia found a place to thrive despite a rocky road. Although she was overwhelmed with academic requirements, Patricia graduated in September 2017 ahead of schedule! And she recently purchased a new car!




